


# William Richard Hill

William (Bill). Hill, 91, passed away February 16, 2018.

He was born August 25, 1926 to late William Raymond Hill and Ruby Violet Hill. He is survived by his wife Margaret Jeane Hill, son Paul Richard Hill, daughter Janet Hill Wharton and son William Robert Hill. He was preceded in death by daughter Joyce Jeane Zillinger and grandson Benjamin William Wharton. His life was blessed with eleven grandchildren and twenty-one great grandchildren. He is also survived by his brothers, Robert Hill, David Beltz, Mike Hill, and Mark Hill.



Bill graduated from the Indianapolis Arsonel Technical High School, in June before being drafted into the US Army in 1944. He was discharged in 1946, having



served with the noted 96<sup>th</sup> Infantry division on Okinawa. When the 96<sup>th</sup> Division returned to the United States he was transferred to the 86<sup>th</sup> Division, and before leaving Manila he served as City Editor of the Daily Pacifican an Army Newspaper under USIS authority.

When he returned from the WWII in 1946 “Richard” married Margaret Jeane Bartholomew on November 9, 1946.. They were married in the Centenary Christian Church in Indianapolis. He was a devoted husband for the seventy-one years of their marriage.

He was employed briefly at Eli Lilly's Paper Package Company beginning in 1942 and then at Bowes Seal Fast Company where he met his future wife.

He sharpened his writing skills while authoring many stories on the website. In his later years he spent hours amassing first-person stories and tributes of his wartime buddies for posting.

Returning home from the war he was employed by RCA, Coca-Cola, Roadway Trucking, and Allison, GM for 38 years as a Machine Repair tradesman. He retired in 1989 and later organized many functions with his retired friends. He enjoyed



working for Kelly Services.

He was a proud member of UAW-CIO Local 933. He was active in Democrat politics.

He was a Boy Scout Master in Roachdale for ten years and served the Cub Scout.

He was baptized into the Body of Christ in the Roachdale Indiana Christian Church where he served several

positions. At his passing he was a member of the congregation of Kingsway Christian Church. He enjoyed analyzing the scriptures.

Richard and Jeane raised their four children in Roachdale, Indiana until 1988 when they moved to Indianapolis. They each retired soon after. They spent their retirement years enjoying their family, grandchildren, great-grandchildren and many dear friends.

Bill was active in many Veteran groups, the Indy Honor Flight and the WWII Roundtable. He made WWII presentations at many schools while sharing his experiences as a young man going off to war.

Bill Hill was a gregarious man, fond of humor, delighting in writing, perfecting his calligraphy, and watching the Colts and the Pacers. He often said, "If you can make someone's day brighter by just doing one little thing – Do It!"

And he did.
