

I grew up speaking both French and English. Like many second generation immigrants, the older I became the less French I spoke in my daily life.

My parents were married November 29, 1923 at St Annes church in Lawrence, Massachusetts.



Here is St Anne's Church at the corner of Haverhill and Franklin streets. It was originally named French Church.



The marriage certificate from the church of Saint Anne, also in French! There were many immigrant families from Quebec in our parish.

Lawrence was a very dynamic city with immigrants from Ireland, Germany, Italy, Lebanon, Poland, and England. In 1920 the population was 94,270, of which forty-five percent were foreign born.



Later they would move to 24 Kensington Street. I was born at that address in this house. It was upstairs, on the side with the balcony. What a big beautiful house. I remember living there upstairs.







That is me in the baby carriage, and below I look happy to be outside.


Look how bundled up I am here! It is cold in New England so we always had to wear warm clothes in the winter.






it gets cold in New England! I grew up in Lawrence, Massachusetts.




















Here I am with my Uncle Jean playing in the garden. It is hard to see but I am wearing his glasses. This was July 19, 1926.


My little sister and I riding our bikes, or maybe we are resting now.




We lived at 6 Butler

March 3, 1928



















September 9, 1928



The girl with the cat is my cousin Pauline Letendre. She came over our house for dinner very often and always wanted to sit next to my father. She called him Papa.






Here we are in the winter and in the summer. Our little brother Louis sure was a lot of fun.

Here we are lined up for our first communion. Can you see me? I am right in the center. Look at our fancy white gloves! This was on May 30, 1935.


On the next page is a close-up of the medals we are wearing. Can you believe I still have it? Yes sir!

I like our old car in this picture. We had such nice times all of us.










There were forty-six boys in our graduating class from St. Anne's in 1939. The next year we would be at Central Catholic High School. Big stuff! I am in the front row second from the left.

Here is my driver's license. Not even a photo or a fingerprint on it.




Look at our driver license back then! No photo, no fingerprint, no nothing!




My buddies and I were all drafted and given two week deferments so that we could graduate from high school. Here is my first photo in uniform.
